# What is the ideal structure of your event/series?

- A series of 4–6 films screened weekly within a month during evening/late-night spots.
- Slotting this series some time during the Halloween/Autumn season would be ideal, but it could run at any point in the year (especially January, which is when the original series ran).

# **Concept –** Give us your curatorial statement. What do you want to show, and/or how?

 Black Gloves and Red Lights returns to delve deeper into the captivating world of Giallo cinema. Set against the backdrop of 1960s Italy, a turbulent era marked by the scars of a failed fascist dictatorship and the aftermath of war, this series continues to explore the genre's mesmerizing blend of horror, thriller, and murder mystery.

 Black Gloves and Red Lights is a tour of Giallo film, the gruesome psychosexual whodunit thriller genre that arose in mid century Italian cinemas. Inspired by the giallo (Italian for "yellow") pulp paperback crime novels of the era, giallo cinema is a violent and surreal, and often nihilistic romp that challenges the audience to stay one step ahead of the black-gloved killer's tracks.

- Word of mouth among local horror and genre film fans. Local businesses in the area could be interested in helping promote the series, with some potential cross-promotional tie-ins.
- I can create and prepare a themed cocktail for at least one of the screenings.
- I also have a pre-existing visual identity for this series and will be doing the posters again for all the films.
